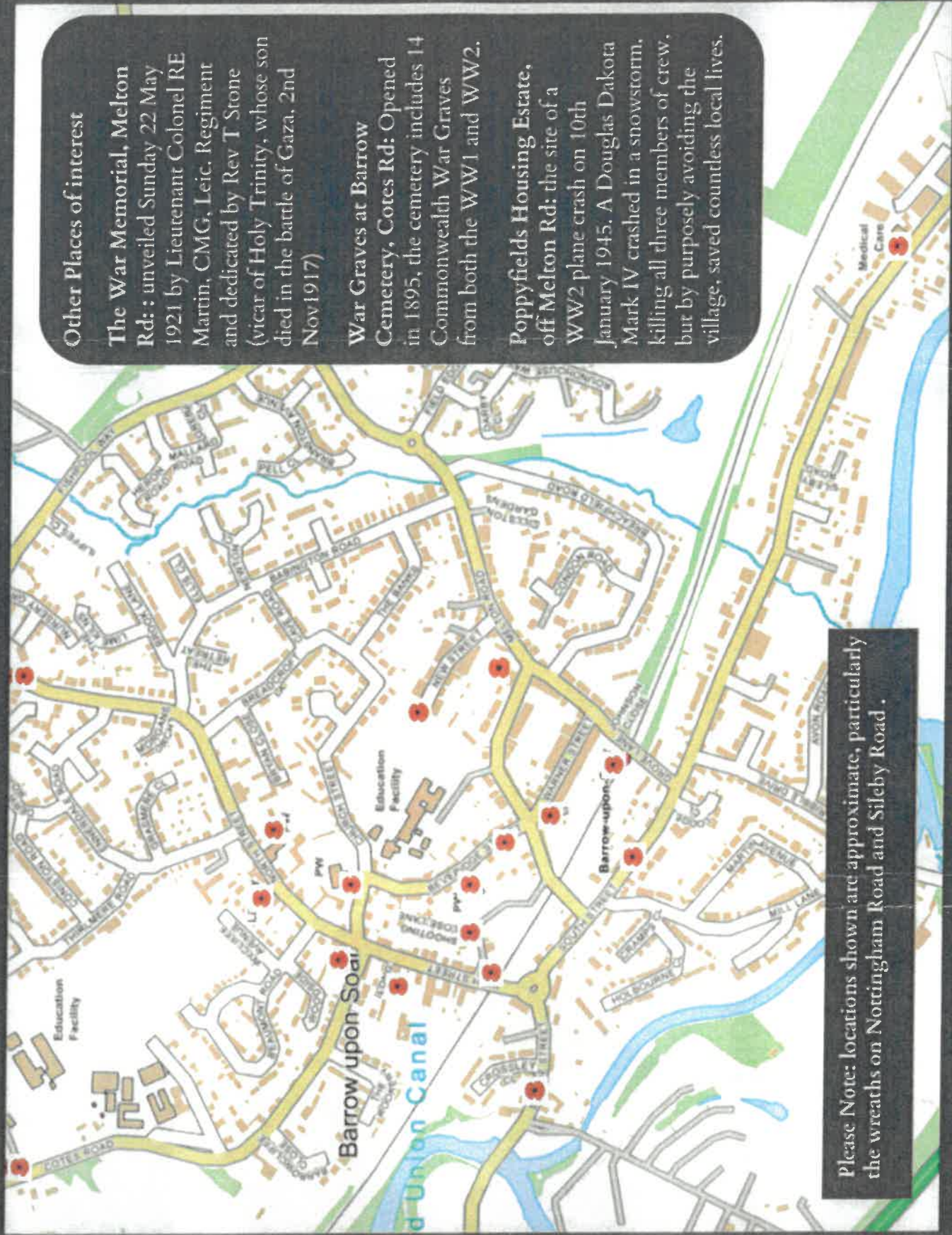


**Other Places of interest**

**The War Memorial, Melton Rd:** unveiled Sunday 22 May 1921 by Lieutenant Colonel RE Martin, CMG, Leic. Regiment and dedicated by Rev T Stone (vicar of Holy Trinity, whose son died in the battle of Gaza, 2nd Nov 1917)

**War Graves at Barrow Cemetery, Cotes Rd:** Opened in 1895, the cemetery includes 14 Commonwealth War Graves from both the WW1 and WW2.

**Poppyfields Housing Estate, off Melton Rd:** the site of a WW2 plane crash on 10th January 1945. A Douglas Dakota Mark IV crashed in a snowstorm, killing all three members of crew, but by purposely avoiding the village, saved countless local lives.



Please Note: locations shown are approximate, particularly the wreaths on Nottingham Road and Sibley Road.
